

Saving the environment through energy efficiency is the need of the hour. Energy conservation, sustainability, safety and environmental protection are interlinked and technologies promoting them need to be developed – this was at the core of the 14th edition of RACON organised by Kolkata Chapter on December 7 and 8 at Novotel, Newtown (Rajarhat). The theme of the conference this year was 'Next Generation Technologies for Building & Industrial Services'. A record 500 delegates had registered for the conference.

Curtain Raiser

The Curtain Raiser of the event was held on the evening of December 6. A two-minute silence was observed in memory of Dr. Prem C. Jain and Anil Maheshwari – industry stalwarts who passed away recently. Manoj Chakravorti, President-Emeritus of Kolkata Chapter, welcomed the delegates. C. 
Urjavaran at Thiruvananthapuram
