

Greetings to all ISHRAE members!

Our journey during the last three months of Society Year 2018-19 has been pretty exciting. Chapters and Sub-chapters at 42 locations across the country have got the new Chapter Working Committee (CWC) teams in place, and the Standing and Apex Committees that support the various activities of ISHRAE have charted the plans for the year. All these actions are aimed at providing the *25,000 plus* member community in particular and the HVAC&R industry at large a focused attention on meeting their expectations from ISHRAE.

In line with the theme of the year, i.e., STAR – Sustain, Technical Excellence, Advocacy and Research – we kick-started the year drawing up plans for execution as well as defining our goals for the next five years.

Sustain

We have ensured that the initiatives that have been taken up in the past years are continued with greater strength and momentum. An ad-hoc committee is in place to draw the ISHRAE Strategic Vision 2025.

Technical Excellence

The Programs team has planned to conduct good quality technical programs on diverse topics at various locations across the country. Also, a host of National and International level technical programs, workshops and conferences have been planned. ISHRAE's flagship technical seminar – Urjavran – in addition to being held in almost 25 locations within the country, is going to be held overseas in Nepal, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka as well.

Various ISHRAE Technical Groups (ITGs) are in place with the objective of enhancing the technical content and deliverables to members. This has drawn huge support from the member fraternity and so many members have volunteered to be part of these ITGs. We welcome more members to join.

In the area of education and training, our flagship programs ISHRAE Certified Professional (ICP) in the areas of Service, Cleanroom and AC Design have been lined up at multiple locations during the current year. Work is underway to get a host of new ICP courses rolling out – for example Drafting, Commissioning, Refrigeration, Building Automation Systems and Health-Care. Also, the four month Advanced Engineering Diploma Course (AEDC) is running its current editions in Bangalore, Delhi and Bhubaneswar. We are glad to inform you that students from these courses are being fully absorbed by the industry.

We have launched Skill Development Programs in the area of unitary systems training for service personnel in eight locations.

Various programs are being planned for the 12,000 plus student members in the form of industrial visits, quizzes, technical talks, paper presentations, ISHRAE Student Project Grants, National Student Design Competition, ISHRAE Job Junction, Equipment Showcases at select locations, etc.

Advocacy

We had a great start for advocacy in this Society Year. Our dear friends from China Association of Refrigeration invited us to be part of their CR2018 in Beijing and we had an excellent meeting with them during which they extended full support to ISHRAE's ACREX and RefCold events and various other initiatives. ISHRAE was well received by REHVA, the Federation of European Heating, Ventilating and Air-conditioning Associations, for their annual meetings and awards.

AICTE- ISHRAE Faculty Development Programs are being held in AICTE approved locations in Bangalore, Guwahati and Chandigarh.

Continuous interaction is happening with various associate societies such as RAMA, AIACRA, RATA, IAQA, AAR, FSAI, GBCI, AWESOME, IoR, REHVA, ASHRAE, SHASE, IGBC, ASSOCHAM, BEE, BIS, MOEFCC, UNEP, IAPMO, IFMA, SAREK, TTMD, CREDAI and a number of others to host joint technical sessions, seminars and other activities. This is an important area where ISHRAE has made a huge impact.

Research

ISHRAE has identified research as a very important dimension of growth, is completing the research projects that were launched in the previous years and has also launched new areas of research. This is being carried out with the support of the academia, and premier universities and institutions like IIT Madras, MNIT Jaipur, College of Engineering – Guindy and Pune, IIT Kharagpur, CEPT Ahmedabad and many more. We have had discussions with DST and SERB and are working closely with them on mutually funded projects that have industry relevance and application. We thank the industry and individuals who are supporting these research activities.

RefCold

It gives us pleasure to inform you that ISHRAE is organising RefCold India 2018 – India's first International Exhibition and Conference on Cold Chain, Industrial Refrigeration and Reefer Transportation – on November 22-24 at Ahmedabad. The event will cover all sections of the refrigeration and cold chain industry and bring all the stakeholders together under one roof. It will also provide a platform to the global investment community to connect with stakeholders in the refrigeration and cold chain sectors in India. We are working closely with UNEP and various ministries connected with this sector.

ACREX

All preparations are underway for our flagship event ACREX India 2019, which will also host a string of workshops and seminars. It will bring together exhibitors from domestic as well as international markets.

Youth and Women

The strength of Youth@ISHRAE and Women@ ISHRAE is ever increasing in numbers and they support the multi-level activities happening at various Chapters and Sub-chapters as well as the various initiatives taken at HQ level.

The 8th Regional Summit of Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment (GRIHA) was held at Courtyard by Marriott, Mumbai on June 28-29 with the theme Choosing Sustainable, Building Sustainable. The Summit was organised by GRIHA, TERI, Sustainability Initiatives and Maharashtra PWD. ISHRAE, ASHRAE Mumbai Chapter, Building Association of India, All India Association of Industries and Smart Cities Council India were the Concept Partners.

Sanjay Seth, CEO, GRIHA Council, welcomed the delegates. Anagha Paranjape-Purohit from Sustainability Initiatives made a brief address.

The keynote address was delivered by Ar. Sangeet Sharma of SD Sharma & Associates on the theme 'The Value of GRIHA - an Approach to Passive Architectural Design'.



The first session, chaired by Sanjay Seth, was on the subject 'Connecting the Outside to India'. It was addressed by Sudhir Paliwal (Expert Member, Maharashtra State Fly Ash Council), Ar. Rajan Rawal (Executive Director, CARBSE, Ahmedabad) and Isaac Emmanuel (Head - Industrial Marketing & Advocacy, Polyurethanes at Covestro





The next session was on 'Low Energy Materials for Interiors'. It was addressed by Harish Borah (ADW Developments Ltd. London and New Delhi), Nidhi Gupta (Sustainability Consultant, Auroville Consulting, Auroville) and Tushar Kant (Amravati).

A session on 'Innovations and Entrepreneurship' followed, addressed by Abhijeet Gawade (Head - Business Development, Godrej Construction) who spoke about recycled concrete blocks and pavers, Shreedhar Pandya (Sustainability Adviser, DNP Infrastructures Pvt. Ltd.) and Mahesh Gangaramani (Perfect Infraengineers Ltd.) who introduced Suntrac thermal hybrid panel.

The first session on Day 2 was on 'Improving Energy Efficiency in Green Buildings'. It was addressed by Jayesh Vira (MD at Enviro Consultancy Pvt. Ltd.) and Amol Desai (GM – Business Development at Supreme Petrochem Ltd.).



'Significance of Materials for Indoor Environmental Quality' was the theme of the next session. The speakers were Sanjeev Karpe (MD at Native Konbac Pvt. Ltd.) who explored bamboo as a construction material, and Pradeep Joshi (Green Build Products, Pune) who spoke on waterless construction. Atul Chavan (Superintendent Engineer, PWD,

Aurangabad) spoke about PWD's Role in Green Buildings. A presentation was made by Abhinav Gupta (Co-founder and Director, Active Buildings).

GRIHA has developed a guidancecum-training tool for small stand-alone buildings, called SVARGRIHA. The tool was demonstrated in the afternoon session by Gautam Aswani, Senior Project Officer, GRIHA Council.

The valedictory address was delivered by Sandeep Patil, Chief Engineer, PWD, Maharashtra.

Bangalore Chapter conducted a Technical Talk on Under Floor Air Distribution Systems on June 22. The speaker was Kevin Pedrigi.




The program was conducted at Hotel Chalukya, and was attended by more than 76 delegates.
